More access to foreign language: beginning Spanish for 6th graders. Spanish 1 and 2 for 7th and 8th. Student take end of course exam in order to get the high school credit.

Staff/Parent/Student surveys:

Feedback from surveys: Some teachers don't feel like admin is not visible enough in a helping role. Feels as if only in when evaluating Eagle Hour is too much 4 times per month (a lot to organize and keep up (teachers)). Students were enjoying it. Discipline consistency was also brought up. Bullying was handled well. Some behavioral issues are not addressed appropriately teachers felt.

Student survey feedback should be shared with student council in order to make the changes the student body want.

More electives are going to be offered with the hiring of a new Art teachers.
