

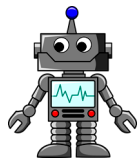


Sebastian STEAM Summer Reading 2018-2019

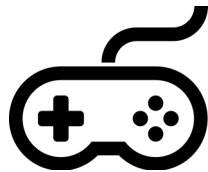

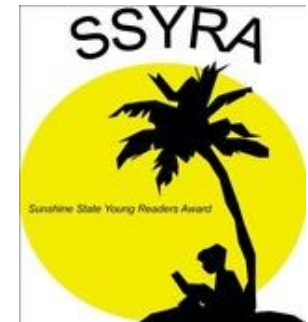
