### Biology Students Visit Guana

Mrs. Nall's Biology Honors class recently went on a field study to GTMNERR (Guana

Tolomato Matanzas National Estuarine Research Reserve). Students learned about the importance of an estuary and gathered data on environmental conditions and water quality. Students used seining techniques to collect crabs, shrimp and fish, and had to identify and keep count of the marine life. Students

explored the science education center, learning about habitats, maps, shells, aquariums and even got to look at a bald eagle through a telescope. The data stu-



dents gathered will be put in to the National Estuary data base for GTMNERR. It was a great day for a science field study—a true outdoor laboratory!
