#### **Exceptional Student Education** (ESE) at SMS

Our SMS family includes three selfcontained classrooms which serve students with a variety of intellectual and physical

special needs. We currently have 21 students enrolled in 3 self-contained classrooms taught by Ms. Catherine Brewster, Mr. Carl Barber and Ms. Rebecca Bradshaw, along with Paraprofessional staff Ms. Lois Corpuz, Ms. Jessica Dawsey, Mr. Lance Layman, and Ms. Cindy Weedman. Each classroom provides a varying exceptionality (VE) resource setting where students receive special education alongside peers diagnosed with other disabling conditions. Our emphasis is on developing functional and academic skills in a creative, hands-on environment with small student to staff ratios. Throughout the year, students enrolled in our Gifted Education elective classes and our 8<sup>th</sup> grade WEB leaders will partner with students in our self-contained classrooms on special projects, which provides a wonderful learning opportunity for all involved.

We invite parents to help support an adaptive and sensory learning environment in these classrooms by making donations of the following items:
