

Poetic rhythm

Ask your youngster to read a verse slowly and drum the rhythm on an upside-down pot or bucket, striking the drum once for each syllable. Example: "One po-ta-to, two po-ta-to, three po-ta-to four." Ingredients: poem or song, "drumsticks" (pencils or chopsticks), pot or bucket


