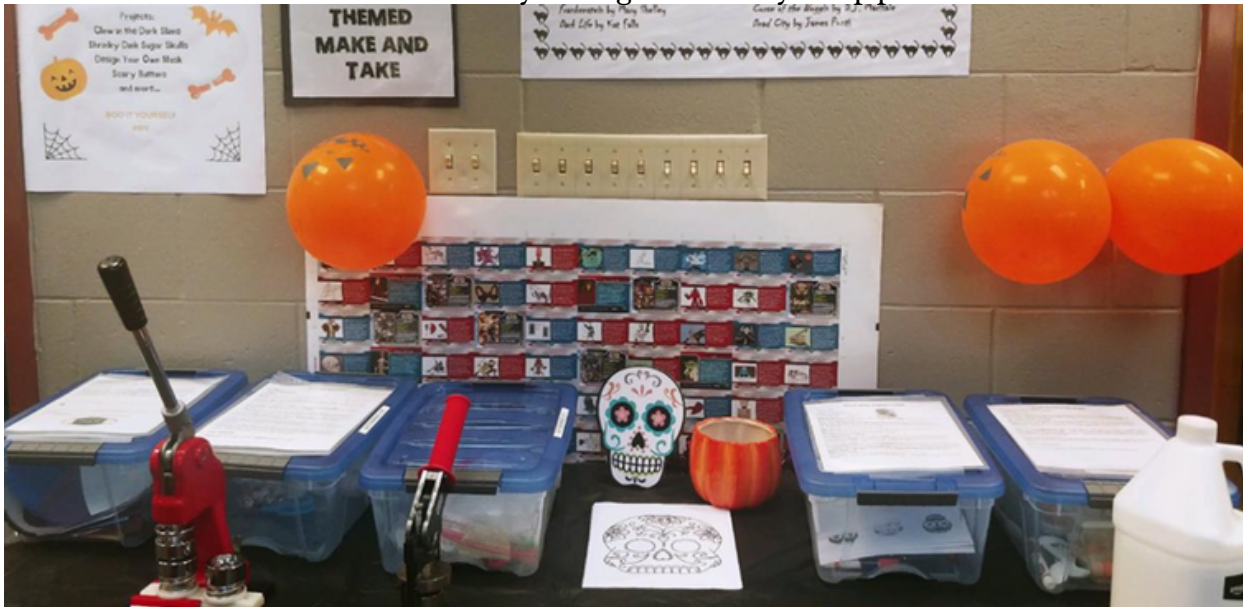

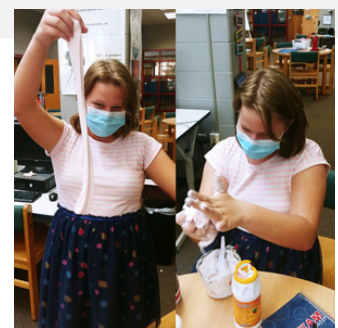
## DESIGN A MASK

Measure ingredients, make a mistake, rethink the process. This is what many students did to create their glow in the dark slime.

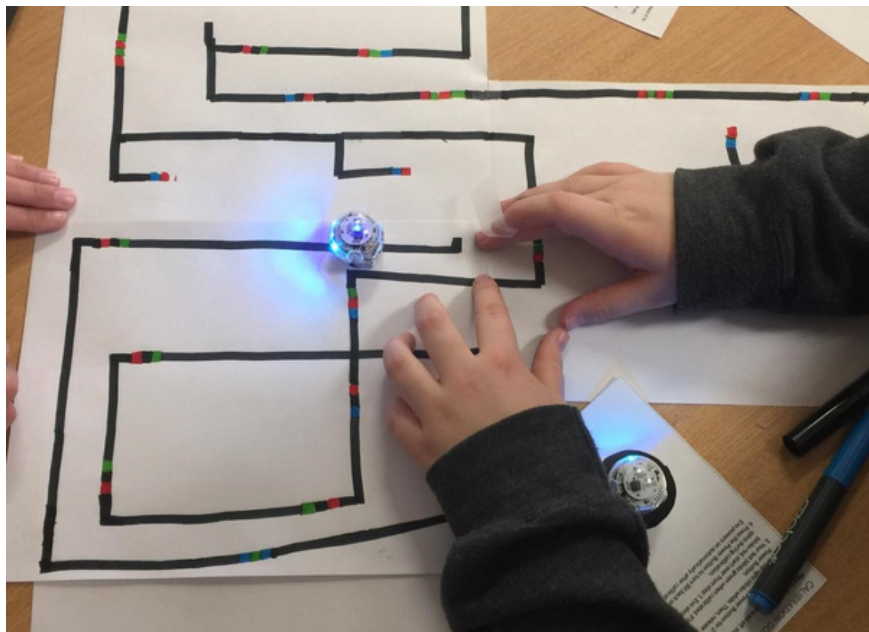


## CRITICALLY THINKING OF OTHERS

Mrs. DeAcutis's 6th grade Critical Thinking class is collaborating with the Media Center to develop a service learning project that would help the homeless by donating items to Home Again St. Johns, a nonprofit organization dedicated to helping the homeless become self-sufficient. The idea sprang from the novel, *The Remarkable Journey of Coyote Sunrise*, where the main character looks for a box of memories based on loved ones.

Students will be putting together these Boxes of Love filled with needed items to be delivered by December 17th. We are asking for the following items: face masks, socks, blankets, towels, hygiene products, t-shirts, small hand sanitizers, sewing kits, bug spray, razors, coffee mug, reusable water bottles, snacks, and instant coffee and tea bags. Donations can be brought to the Media Center by December 4th.





# THE ART OF OZOBOTS

On October 30th, Ms. Hagy brought her art classes to the Media Center to understand how art and technology work together by creating art with Ozobots. Ozobots are tiny robots that use sensors to read codes created by color combinations made by markers. To observe Halloween, students created paths for the Ozobots to follow based on haunted houses, pumpkin patches, and corn mazes. Then they were given the freedom to create their own designs. Some of these designs were pumpkins, race tracks, and free form designs.

The Ozobots were borrowed from NEFLIN (Northeast Florida Information Network) and from the Instructional Resources of St. Johns School District and will be in the Media Center until November 24th. If you would like to collaborate on a lesson that would use Ozobots, please see Mrs. Barnard and we can make it happen.
