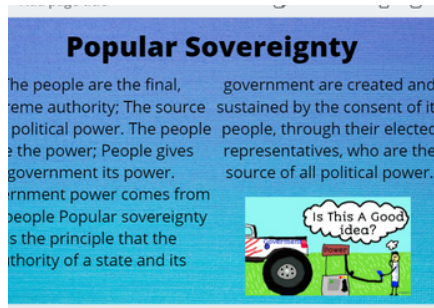
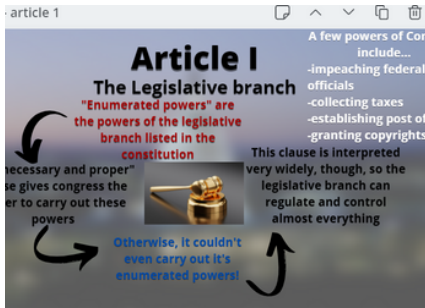
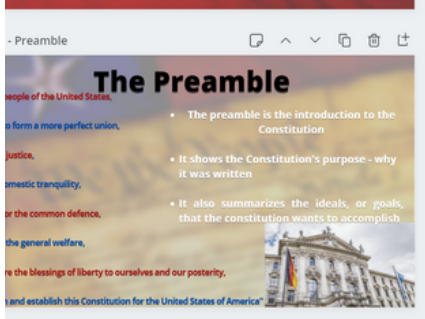

A GREAT WAY TO SPEND PBIS POINTS



Students can use PBIS points to create projects in the Media Center's Make and Take Makerspace. With the Silhouette Cameo, students can create designs to personalize masks and t-shirts. Shrink Paper can be converted into earrings, pins, or even ornaments. Slime is still going strong. We also will have the button maker through December. In January, we will have a 3D printer borrowed from NEFLIN that students can use to create designs through Tinkercad. These projects cost the students ten PBIS Points to be able to participate in them during their lunch time. Students need to see the Media Center in the morning to get a special pass to come out of the cafeteria to participate in these projects.
