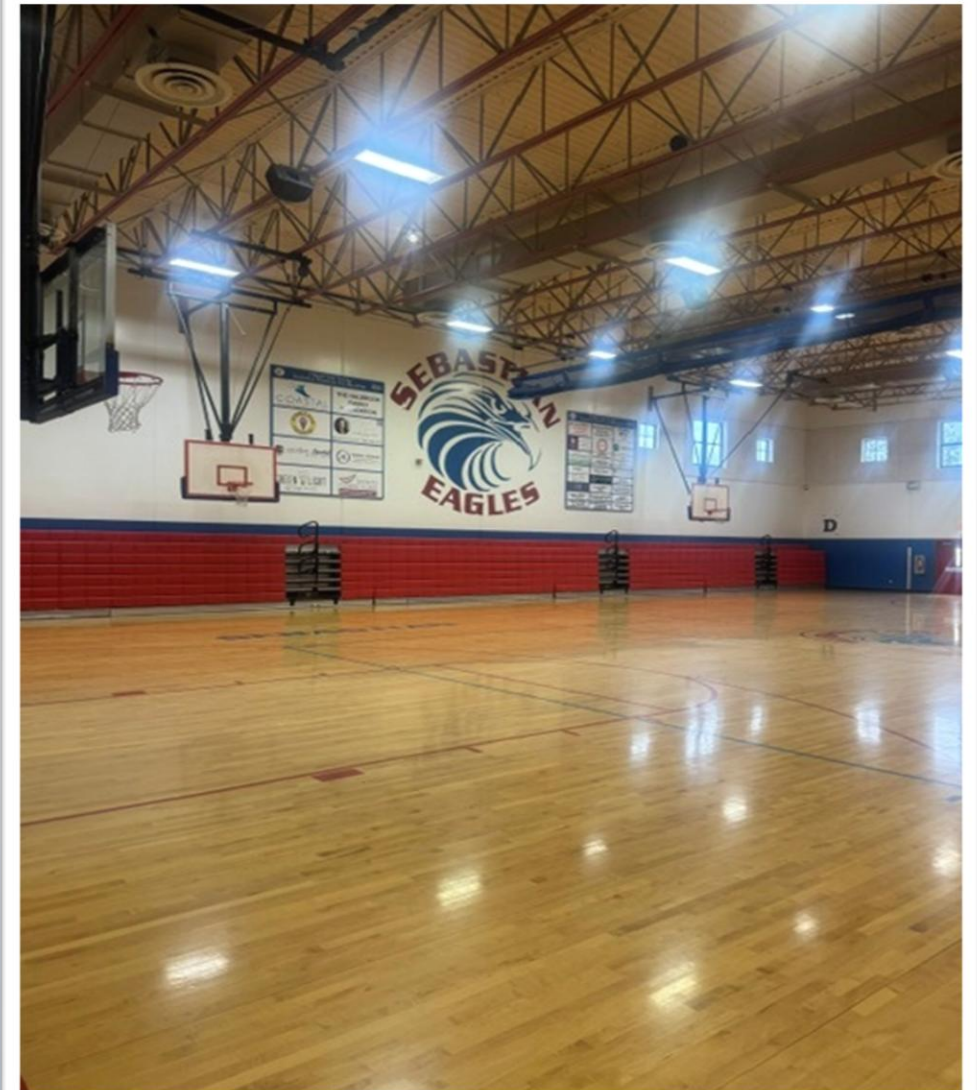

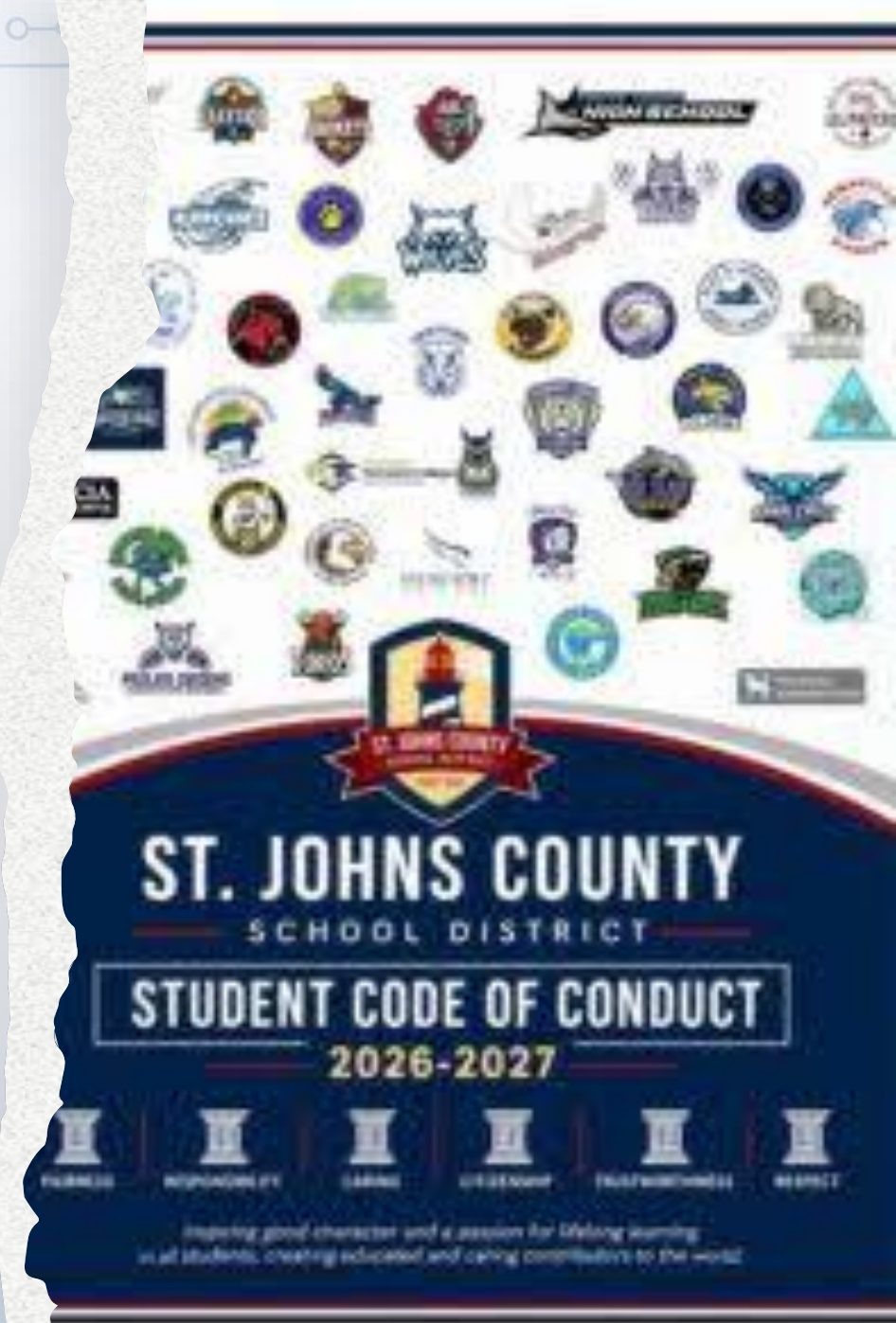
Cell Phones & Electronic Devices

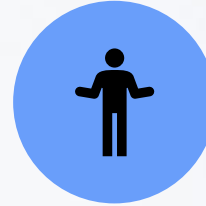
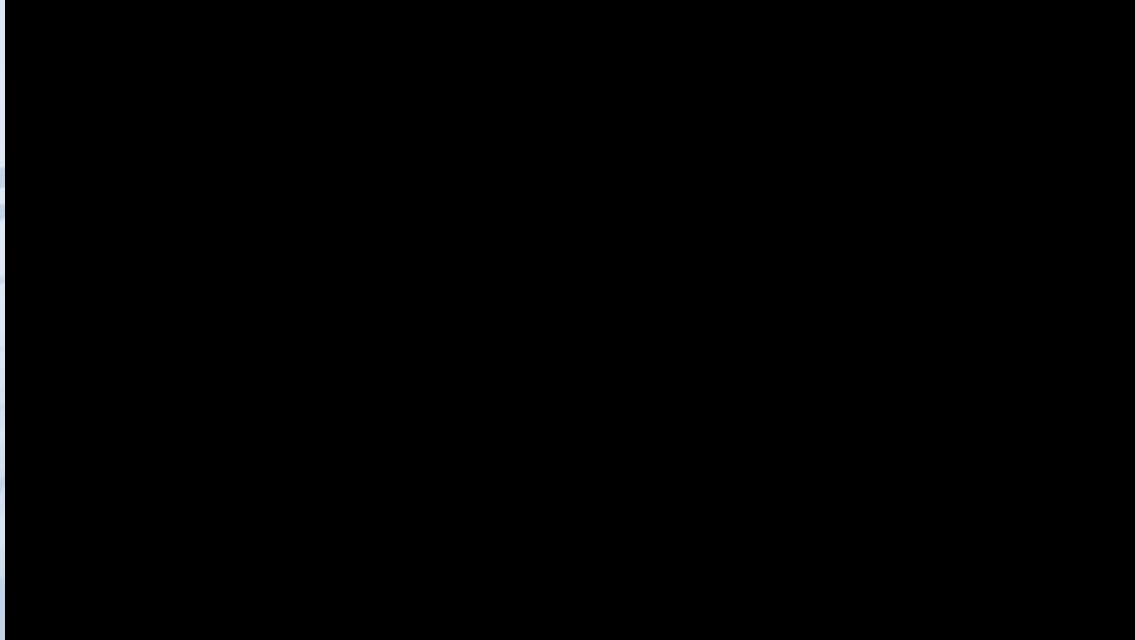
Hallway Expectations

- Once the bell rings, you will have **3 minutes** to get to your next class.

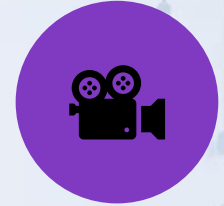
Four minutes is enough time when we:

 - Every class period matters, and every minute of learning counts.

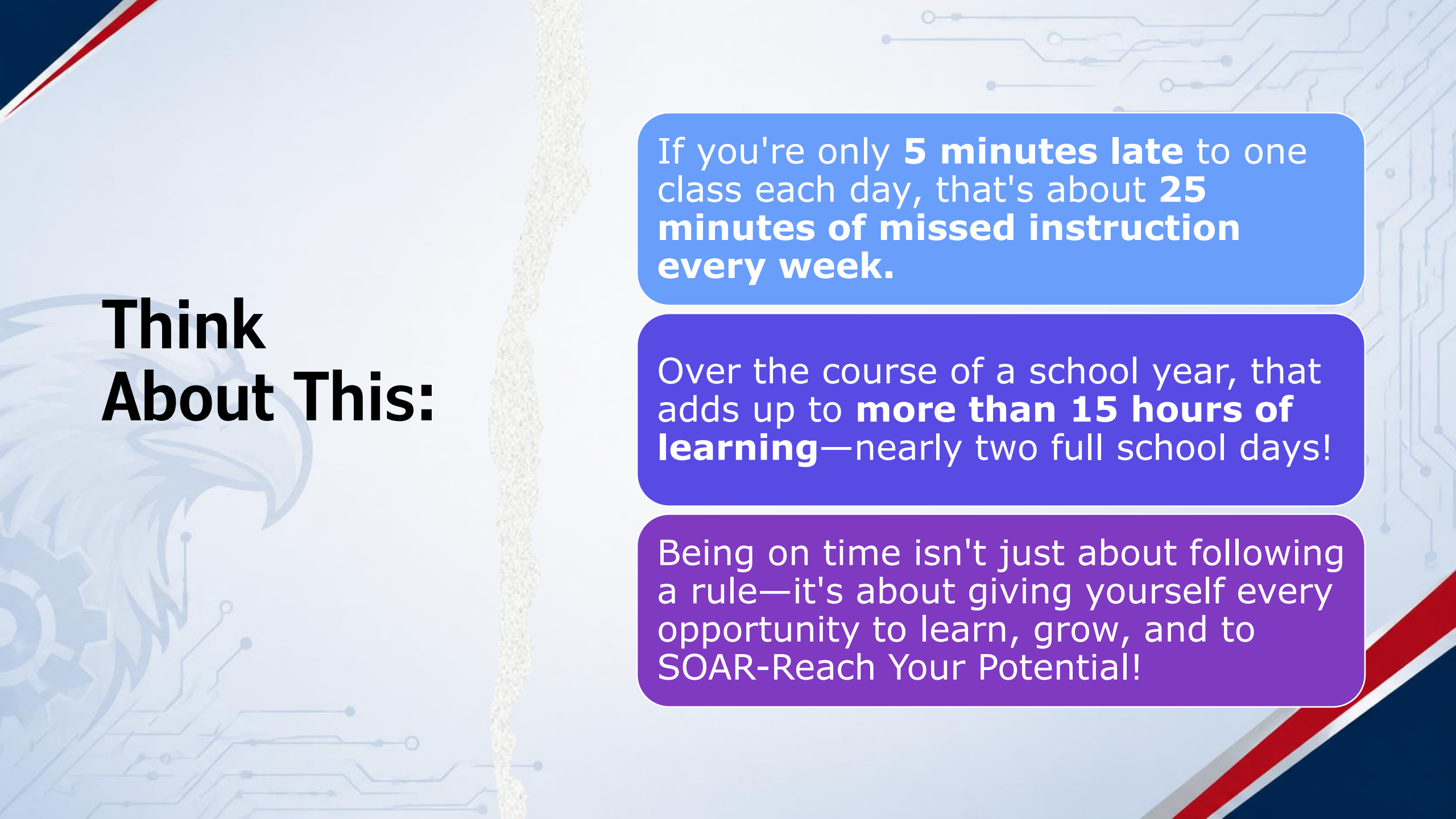

Why Your Attendance Matters

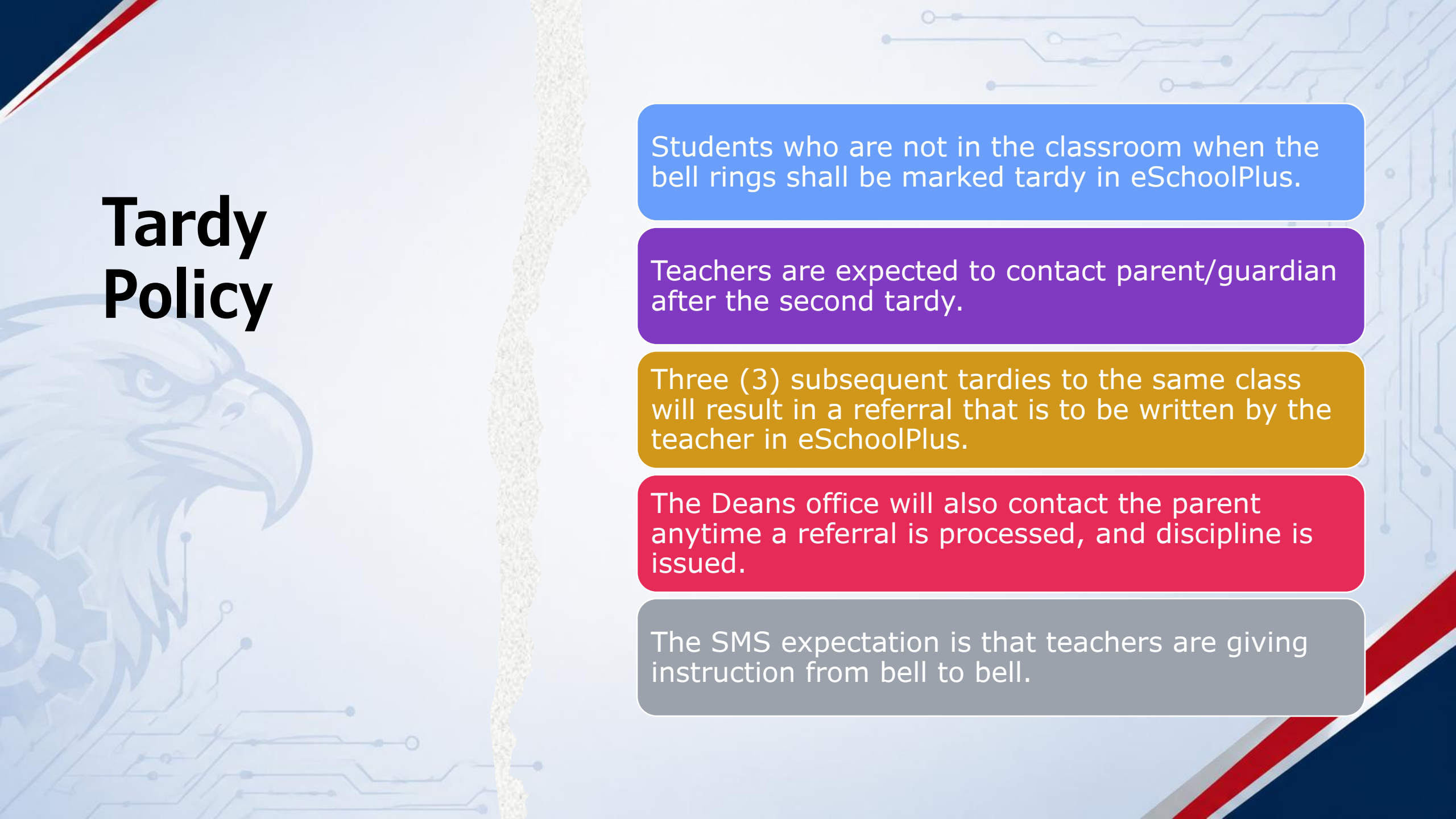
#1 **Spread Your Wings Through Learning-** Every class builds on the one before it, so being here helps you grow, learn, and succeed as you reach new heights!

Tardy Policy

Students who are not in the classroom when the bell rings shall be marked tardy in eSchoolPlus.

Teachers are expected to contact parent/guardian after the second tardy.

Three (3) subsequent tardies to the same class will result in a referral that is to be written by the teacher in eSchoolPlus.

The Deans office will also contact the parent anytime a referral is processed, and discipline is issued.

The SMS expectation is that teachers are giving instruction from bell to bell.

SOAR Every Period

This year, we're excited to recognize students who consistently demonstrate responsibility through our **PBIS Rewards** program.

Every class period is a new opportunity to earn a **PBIS Rewards point**.

- Here's how: Be **ON Time**.
- When you arrive before the bell, are in your assigned seat, and are ready to begin learning, your teacher will award you an **ON Time PBIS Rewards point**.
- Think about it—you have **seven opportunities every day** to earn points simply by demonstrating responsibility and being prepared.
- Those points can be used for rewards, incentives, special events, and other exciting opportunities throughout the school year.
- Being responsible has its rewards!

Dismissal

New Bike Rack

- Once you have locked your bike or scooter, please enter the building using the main entrance.
- The bike rack gate will be locked at 7:30am and unlocked at 1:50pm.





Electric Bike & Scooter Reminders

Students riding their bicycles **or electric bicycles** to school must wear a safety helmet and adhere to requirements of the law as specified in F.S 316.2065 and 316.20655.

For safety reasons, students should never ride bicycles **or electric bicycles** on school grounds.

Students must disembark their bicycle **or electric bicycle** at the entry gate and walk their bicycle **or electric bicycle** to the designated storage area.



Electric Bike & Scooter Reminders

The same protocol is expected for exiting the campus. Students are encouraged to lock their bicycles upon arrival.

Students and their families are responsible for charging the batteries of electric bicycles and schools are not to be expected to charge electric bicycles. Sebastian Middle School is NOT responsible for lost or stolen items.

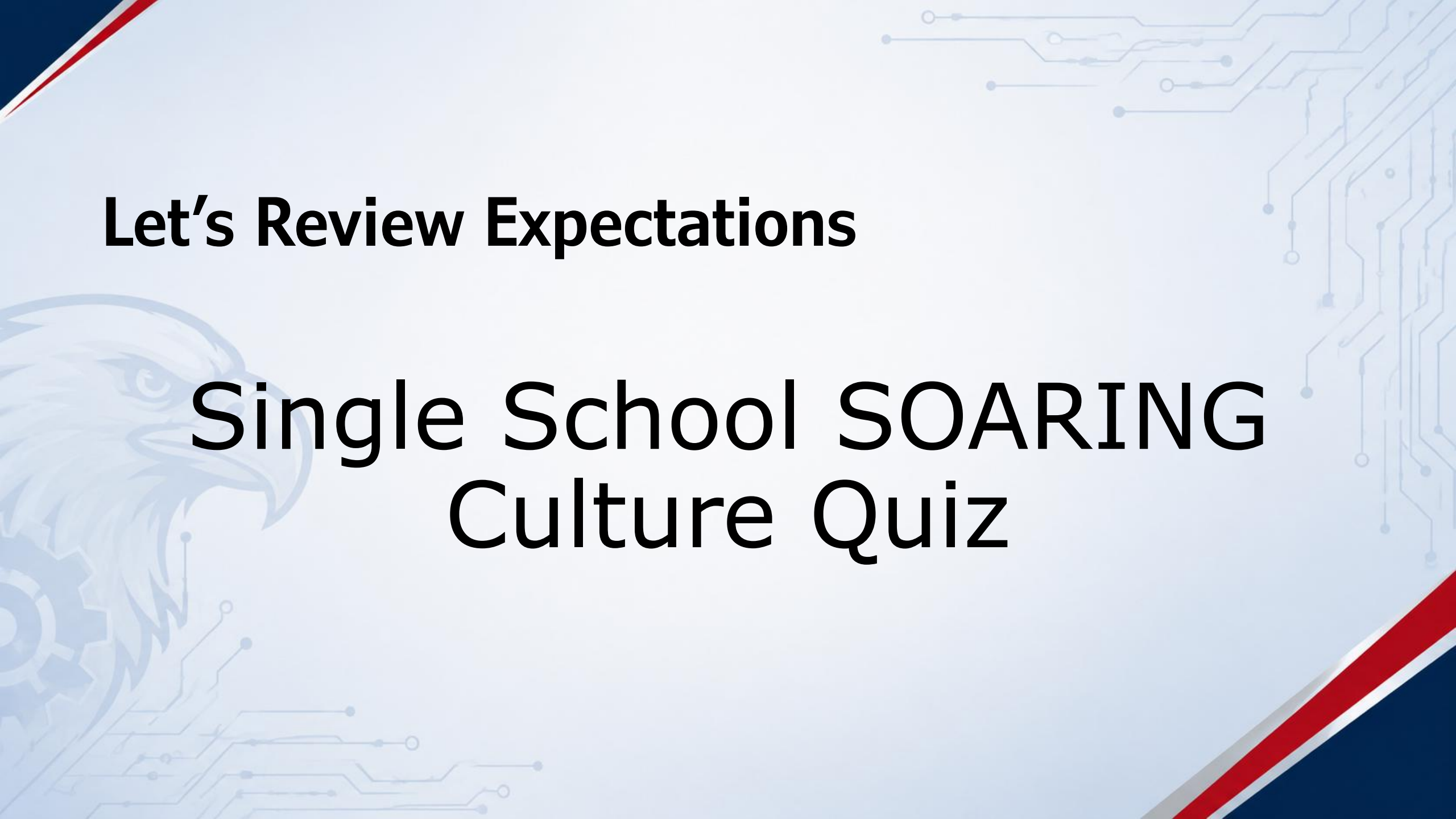
